



# DISCOVERING THE DOLOMITES



The Dolomites are a spectacular mountain range located in northern Italy, mainly in the Trentino-Alto Adige and Veneto regions. They were designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2009 for their exceptional natural beauty and geological importance. The Dolomites are renowned for their iconic peaks and unique rock formations. The mountains are characterized by steep rock faces, jagged ridges and imposing peaks, offering breathtaking scenery.

# Day 1: Departure for the Dolomites

 Arrival at Venice airport and pick up your rental car. Drive to the village of Cortina d'Ampezzo, a ski resort perfectly situated in the heart of the Dolomites. Cortina d'Ampezzo is renowned for its beauty and the many activities it offers.



#### Day 2: Lake Misurina / Tre Cime di Lavaredo

Set off for Lake Misurina, the pearl of the Dolomites and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. At an altitude of over 1,700 metres, it is the largest lake in the entire region.

Take a 3 to 4-hour hike up to the Tre Cime di Lavaredo, for an exceptional panorama that will leave you breathless.







#### Day 3: Lake Sorapiss or Braies and Brunico

Lake Sorapiss is a magnificent and unique lake accessible from the Passo Tre Croci. The ascent takes 4 hours, but is renowned as one of the most beautiful hikes in the Dolomites.

 Lac de Braies is one of the most beautiful lakes in the Dolomites. Afterwards, head for the village of Brunico, an ancient medieval village where you can enjoy local beers and Sarcher pies.

#### Day 4: Falzarego / Canazei

 Take the road to Val di Fassa, one of the main valleys of the Dolomites. We recommend a stop at Falzarego, where you can step back in time to the First World War and visit some old trenches. Finally, head for the village of Canazei.



#### Day 5: Ortisei / Seceda

 Stop off at Ortisei, a small village famous for its wood carvings. Then continue on to Seceda, from where you can take the cable car and admire another view of the Fermeda and Gran Odla peaks. Seceda is said to be the best viewpoint in the whole Gardena valley.





#### Day 6: Val di Fassa / Lac de Carezza et Renon

 Stroll through the small villages of the Val di Fassa and sample the local produce. Next stop is Lake Carezza, a lake of striking color variations that have earned it the nickname Rainbow Lake. Next, take the road to the town of Bolzano. From here, take the Renon cable car and a wooden train (Collalbo) to admire the Renon earth pyramids.

#### Days 7 & 8: Bassano del Grappa

Head for the San Pellegrino Pass and the Dolomites Bellunesi National Park. Stop off at the Valdobbiadene vineyards for a taste of Prosecco. Then visit the monument in Pederobba dedicated to the French soldiers of the First World War. In Possagno, discover the Antonio Canova museum. Finally, explore Bassano del Grappa's famous wooden bridge and Palazzo Sturm with frescoes by Giorgio Anselmi.
